Airfield – Notification has been received by CYC of an appeal by Elvington Park to the noise enforcement order. A Public Inquiry will be held.

Maze. Council agreed to ask for a copy of the application for an organic nursery. At the same time council will support any extension of the site operation to four months. **DH**

9. Reports from recent meetings. Cllr Bailey reported on the Ward Committee meeting: a Ward Grant of £3500 was awarded for the Play Area; speeding has been highlighted by parishes as a priority issue. Local officers are being trained in the use of speed 'guns'. Residents should expect more speed enforcement shortly! Cllr Forster reported on the YLCA York meeting. They are following up the apparent lack of a system for tracking S106 payments in CYC and other parishes.

Cllr Taylor reported from the School Governors meeting.

10. Annual Parish Meeting. Council agreed to approach the maze and the police to provide speakers for the APM. A newsletter item will be prepared. CYC will be approached to see what items could be made available on the night. **DH**

Village Green. Council heard an update on registration process. Council agreed that a formal agreement with the objectors be drawn up for signature. IB/PR/DH
 Play Area. Having obtained a Ward Grant for £3,500, the Parish Council is now

looking to apply for a grant from the Government 'PlayBuilder' fund, administered by CYC, for approximately £45,000. There is a requirement to involve the whole community. Cllrs Bailey, Rees, Taylor along with Mark Gillett and the Clerk will meet to progress as soon as possible.

13. Charter between Local Councils and CYC. Council agreed to accept. DH
14. Bus Service. Subject to CYC budgetary approval, a new off peak service, 19, will replace the off peak 195/196: every two hours, at 14 minutes past the hour, every day of the week, it will run via Wheldrake to York Merchantgate – taking 29 minutes. Return journeys will be at 50 minutes past the hour. The start date is projected to be 27th April. The Clerk will arrange newsletter and notice board announcements. DH

15. Elvington/Sutton Bridge. Cllr Webster highlighted the difficulties of pedestrians and cyclists in safely crossing the bridge. A new bridge was discussed. It was agreed to liaise with Sutton PC to establish the best way of taking this forward. IB/DH
16. Highways, paths and verges. Various repairs have been undertaken in the past

month. CYC is aware of the poor road surface between the traffic lights and bridge and will be repairing. A fence problem in Alvin Walk will be investigated. **DH 17. Flooding Matters.** Cllr Bailey will try to obtain figures showing the number of times
