Minute 11039. Council had no objections to: 11/02201 - Barrett Precision Tubes, Halifax Way - extension 11/02244 - Broad Oak Farm, Dauby Lane - re-siting of overhead line The following Approvals were noted: 11/00631 - Coach House, Elvington Lane - extensions (amended scheme) 11/01607 - Ivy Dene, Main Street - garage to rear 11/01936 - 26 Elvington Park - extension Applications received after publication of this Agenda. There were none. **Other Matter:**

Airfield – The result of the latest court action concerning noise abatement was discussed. Council reiterated that it is not opposed to reasonable activities on the airfield and would encourage Elvington Park and CYC to negotiate a long term agreement.

Village Green. The report on the horse chestnut trees has been received from 10. Harvey Lowson of CYC who also recommends removal of the tree nearest Beckside junction, which is suffering from bleeding canker. It was agreed to obtain quotes for a replacement of a different species and then apply for a York Pride grant to cover the IB/DH costs of felling and replacement.

Sutton Bridge. Conflicting information has been received about whether the 11. temporary weight limit will last for the full duration of the Temporary Order. It was decided to invite Richard Wood of CYC to a future meeting to discuss the possible introduction of an environmental weight limit on Main Street.

12. Allocation of Senior Citizen Bungalows. The response from the Joseph Rowntree Housing Trust was briefly discussed. The Director has agreed to attend next month's meeting.

Bus Services. In order to retain the early morning/late afternoon services to/from 13. York, CYC has insisted that the Parish Council contribute to the cost of the subsidy for a new operator. The services are only extended until 31st December. The Clerk will write to establish what number of passengers is required to ensure the services run in 2012; how is the monitoring to be done; and if the Parish Council can have feedback at an early date. DH

Minute 11040. The payment of £500.00 to CYC for the subsidy was approved Allotments. Duncan Muress and Richard Crinnion expressed the frustration of the 14 Allotment Association at the perceived lack of support in getting land for allotments particularly as funding is in place. Legislation does exist to allow compulsory purchase of land (whether it is the responsibility of CYC or the Parish Council is being established), but the Allotment Association would prefer to lease land. It was decided to write to the Allotment Officer of CYC to offer further help in the search for a local site. DH
