Other Matter. Cllrs asked if notification had been received of work to the rear of Hill Close. The Clerk was able to say that no planning permission was required.

- **10. Environmental Weight Limit.** Cllr Bailey updated Council on his contact with Julian Sturdy, MP in view of CYC's refusal to grant an EWL on Main Street. JS will be contacting CYC to clarify the reasoning and further action is proposed in arranging CYC to meet parents and residents so that the case can be put directly. The exact criteria for an EWL is being established. A petition from the children at the School has been proposed and the PTA are supportive.
- 11. Pumping Station. Cllr Rees reported on the meeting to review the operational procedures at times of potential flooding. Currently both EA and the Drainage Board have to liaise to drop the penstock, clear the grilles and switch on the pumps, but neither wishes to change the current systems. The Drainage Board did reveal that it is considering the installation of remote telemetry of the beck level and pump monitoring. Funding will have to be obtained but the Parish Council indicated that it would consider a contribution if requested.
- **12. Reports from recent meetings.** The Clerk reported that he and Cllr Bailey had attended a session on CYC's new Delivery and Innovation Fund and a further session on eplanning. CYC is to undertake further work in both areas and report back later in the year.
- **13. Highways, paths and verges.** A further request for work to Church Lane outside the Village Hall will be made. Cllr Webster reported that drains were blocked outside the School entrance. **DH**
- **14. Risk Assessment.** Cllrs Rees and Webster will undertake the review and report back for the September meeting. **PR/JW**
