Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held on Tuesday 17th January 2012 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall

1. Councillors Present. Cllrs Bailey; Forster; Taylor; Webster + A Bradley; J Ridge; W Taylor, all of CYC.

2. Apologies. Cllrs Rees; Nicholson; Wilson.

3. Declaration of Interests by Cllrs of any items on this agenda. There were none.

4. Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on 20.12. 2011 were approved as a true record.

5. Matters arising from the minutes not covered in this agenda. There were none.

6. Treemendous York. Wendy Taylor gave an overview of the project which is intended to plant 50,000 trees across York in the next three years. Various organisations have combined to promote the benefits of tree planting. The Clerk will forward details of recent and planned planting. Cllr Webster wondered whether more trees could be planted on Church Green. This will be considered at the next meeting. ALL/DH

7. Bus Services. Andrew Bradley and Julian Ridge thanked the Council for its contribution to the subsidy of the early morning service. They then described the background to the Improvement Study currently underway at CYC. Cllr Bailey described the factors needed to attract car users to use a bus service to York – a frequent, direct and simple to understand service. He also suggested that a shuttle to Grimston Bar Park & Ride should be considered. JR asked about fares, quality of the current service and whether local involvement in running the service was likely. The possibility of making the Sunday and the Maze/Museum summer services include the village centre was also raised. AB and JR are aiming to complete their report by the end of May.
