#### 077/25 Matters arising from the Minutes not elsewhere on this agenda:

- i. Tree of Hope: the project has stalled at the moment although Ad Astra have been awarded a sapling from the tree at Sycamore Gap which will be planted later in the year.
- ii. Church Lane: an email has been received from Yorkshire Water stating that the reinstatement of the road surface was complete. Cllr Laverack has responded to say that the finish is not good enough. He will pursue this. **JL** 
  - Cllr Young reported that water had been gushing from the wall near the Church and that there had been a danger that it could flow back into the churchyard.
- iii. Website: some items still need to be transferred across. Cllr Risker will provide some instruction on its use.
- iv. Double Taxation: Cllr Moorhouse will investigate further into why this allowance has been significantly reduced. **MM**
- v. Railings: the missing posts and railings have now been installed by Morrisons Utilities. It is noted, however, that a wooden post rather than a concrete one has been used.
